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### THE EUCHARIST

Before the Eucharist begins, we keep silence and pray together:

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

We stand when the bell rings, to sing the hymn.

### Songs of thankfulness and praise,

*Celebrant:* In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *People:* **Amen.**

The celebrant introduces the liturgy, and we confess our sins.


We sing the Gloria in excelsis:

We stand for the Peace.

*Celebrant:* The peace of the Lord be always with you. *People:* **And also with you.**
